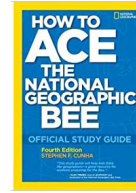


## Online Library Resources

To access the Library's research tools, visit [nolalibrary.org](http://nolalibrary.org). Click "Research" tab in the navigation bar, and then select "Databases." This link will direct you to the [Louisiana Library Connection](#), a webpage that includes links to all of the New Orleans Public Library's databases, as well as statewide databases. Scroll through the Louisiana Library Connection website to find each of the databases listed below. You will need your Library card to access these databases. If you do not know your Library card number, please call any Library location for assistance.

- **Britannica e-Books:** Hundreds of nonfiction downloadable e-books for ages preschool to 18.
- **Britannica Library:** Research sources include three databases, thousands of curated articles and magazines, images, videos, audio clips, primary sources, maps, research tools, and recommended websites, along with a pop-up Merriam-Webster's Dictionary and Thesaurus.
- **Fire Insurance Maps Online:** Fire Insurance Maps online (FIMO), is a research portal to find and view high-definition, color Fire Insurance Maps, Real Estate Atlases, Plat Books, and other historical maps showing building structures, building construction details, property ownership, property uses, and other useful information.
- **HomeworkLouisiana:** Homework help and SAT/ACT and Advanced Placement (AP) Exam preparatory resources.
- **Digital Sandborn Maps:** Digitized maps detailing property and land-use for Louisiana cities and towns. Extensive information is given on building construction and use, street names and addresses, and property boundaries. Map dates range from 1885 to 1951.
